Area Agency on Aging organizations around the United States are celebrating 50 years of serving older adults in our communities. WellWise Services Area Agency on Aging, formerly Region 2 Area Agency on Aging, was incorporated in March of 1974. Oh, what a journey we have been on since that initial formation! Our mission of "Supporting older adults, adults with disabilities and their caregivers to live safely and independently" has held true throughout our 50+ years.

As we celebrate the past year, there are many successes to highlight. Our dedicated team at WellWise Services has gone above and beyond to support our community members, be strong community partners, help those that need us most, and bring our mission to life in an equitable and intentional way.

- We Hear You—Through many community conversations, interacting with older adults and adults with disabilities, and surveys, we learn about needs in the community. Efforts and innovations to address these needs remain part of our strategic work. Connections Café (a monthly gathering to learn and socialize), has been a big hit in our community. Vaccine clinics and in-home vaccinations have helped health and well-being in our community. Our Tiered Care program continues to support folks to stay independent at home. Our Options Counseling assists community members and their caregivers with identifying needed resources.
- We See You—Our senior population continues to grow and as a result the need for our services is increasing. We added new staff to meet the increased needs. Our Safe Haven program is busier than ever helping victims of elder abuse. There is an uptick in homelessness of seniors and adults with disabilities that we are addressing in collaboration with our network partners. We have an ongoing effort to develop our unmet needs funds to aid our community members with limited incomes meet unexpected expenses. We continually evaluate programing to be sure it meets our community needs. Our Community Transition program regularly works through some of the most difficult situations to ensure folks have the options and support needed to go from a facility to their home of choice. Our dedicated staff ensures the MI Choice Waiver program remains an option to help folks receive services and supports at home rather than a facility.
- ** We Count on You—We at WellWise Services value our partners, provider community, volunteers, and donors. We could not do our work without the 90+ contracted providers that go into the homes of our participants to ensure they get the critical care they need to remain in the community. These providers are the "boots on the ground" that make our work happen. Volunteers assist daily with friendly reassurance calls, give unbiased counseling on Medicare and Medicaid options, help out at events and in the office. We are so appreciative. Donors step up regularly to assist with needed programming such as Community Education, Unmet Needs, Holidays at Home, Safe Haven, and others. Many of these efforts would not be sustainable without this funding!
- ** We Hold Ourselves Accountable—Our team works tirelessly to provide the best quality services possible in our community. This means constant assessment to ensure our quality of services meets and goes above expected standards. We pride ourselves on our NCQA accreditation (National Committee for Quality Assurance) that guarantees we are meeting

national standards. Our finance team makes sure controls are in place and followed, and that audits are successful. Our clinical team works closely with our quality team to be sure we are providing the best service possible while meeting all the requirements of our contracts. We also work to support and help our providers to have the correct tools and processes for the safety of those we serve. Our IT and Compliance teams continually work to safeguard our equipment and procedures to ensure that our information remains secure.

- We Advocate with You—We are aware that the increased need for our services and the increased number of older adults in our community are not supported by funding received. We work with our Area Agencies on Aging Association of Michigan, as well USAging, our national association, to be sure the Older Americans Act is reauthorized and supports the needs. We have regular conversations with our legislators to help them understand the needs of seniors and adults with disabilities. We work with our Advisory Council and Board of Directors to get the word out.
- We Are Here for You—Our team continues to be here to support the community. We are proud to say that we personally answer your calls and questions. Our phone rang over 18,000 times in the last year and we are happy to assist caregivers and community members find the supports they need. Our marketing team is readily available to offer presentations, visit groups, businesses, and other agencies, and produce newsletters, social media posts, and ads to share information about the services we offer. Our name change to WellWise Services Area Agency on Aging has resulted in increased awareness of the services and resources we provide.
- We Are Innovative—Our team works strategically to meet needs that our participants and callers identify in our community. We provide Assistive Technology services to aid with daily functions for those we serve. We apply for grants to bring new ideas to life such as our interoperability efforts, transportation solutions, transitional housing, caregiver supports, providing wellness class opportunities in conjunction with other aging partners, reviewing software platforms. We also participate in statewide initiatives for standard reviews, contract discussions and collaborative efforts around statewide contracting, Electronic Medical Review procurement, connectivity to participant status with hospitals, and collaborating with State officials. All of these efforts set us apart and some have brought local, state and national recognition.

We celebrate this milestone with everyone in our service area. We are looking forward to keeping our mission alive and vibrant in our community, with your support, over the next 50 years.

John Hayton has been in and out of the nursing home due to health issues since 2020. He was dependent on others and relied on formal and informal support to help him manage many aspects of his life.

John, while in the nursing facility the last time, decided he wanted to take charge of his own life. He took the initiative to create his own budget, find an apartment for himself, and be his own advocate. He was able to secure accessible and affordable housing so he could move out of the nursing home. He helped find his own caregivers to ensure his transition would be safe and successful. He obtained a car and started managing his own appointments.

John was born in Detroit, grew up in Carleton, Michigan, and worked in a factory. He is married and has six grown children. John likes to paint rocks, read science fiction short stories, and listen to older country music in his spare time. John is kind, and appreciative of the help he has received from the WellWise Services Community Transition Program.

Because of his determination, John went from being dependent on others in the nursing home to living independently; he made choices and took control of his own life. John is an inspiration to others, and we are excited to present this year's Inspiration Award to him!
